


This week's winner of the Behaviour Cup will be Finley M from sparrows class. Finley has worked extra hard in all his lessons this week really making superb progress and engaging well.



This week children in Hummingbirds class took to constructing bridges in teams working together to build a strong structure out of different materials.







Then came the competition to see which bridge was the strongest.




This week the Fireflies have been delving into circle art inspired by the Russian artist Kandinsky. We truly have some artists in the making here at Seven Fields.

Santa here to remind all children that next Friday the 18th December is another festive one and you can wear Christmas coloured outfits to school.




