Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing the newsletter this week on VE day. I do hope you are all taking part. It is a shame that many of our whole school activity days and celebrations have had to be postponed, but we felt this one was too important not to mark somehow. I hope you complete the activities sent out in the latest class dojo message.

I, like you, await the government guidance on how and when schools can be best placed to re-open fully. I add that word at the end “fully” because there is presumption in many quarters that schools are closed however, this school, is and always has been open everyday during this lockdown, and during the Easter break (except for bank holiday weekend) As key workers, we have been clear in ensuring consistent communication and we are grateful you have all understood the need to remain vigilant, with social distancing measures. I have a feeling that when we do start to welcome pupils back to school, it will not be all at once and there is every likelihood that your child will not complete a full week in school, as we maintain social distancing measures.

We will be in touch when more is known and decided later in the week.

You may remember that the theme for my assembly on Monday was persistence. I re-told the story of the frog in the jug who, through his own persistence, was able to keep on going and survive through sheer resilience and will power. We are like that at the moment. We can see the light at the end of the tunnel, but without continuing to follow the guidance on staying home, protecting the NHS and saving lives, we will be risking another spike, something that I would think all of us are fearful of. So, be like the frog-Keep going! We are nearly through the worst and can start to look forward to the brighter future.
