

The Equator- an imaginary line around the middle of a planet.

North Pole - the point that is farthest north on the planet Earth.

South Pole - the point that is farthest north on the planet Earth.

Adapt - finding ways to survive in a place.

Desert- a place where almost no rain falls.

Rainforest - a tall, dense forest that receives lots of rain every year.

Savanna - Tropical, flat grasslands

with scattered trees and shrubs. Found near the equator.

Habitat - the natural home of an animal or plant.
