Passover	The major Jewish spring festival which commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian slavery, lasting seven or eight days .	Jews believe in one God. They also try to live by the Ten Commandments. They include using God's name with respect, remembering the Sabbath, respecting your parents and not lying or stealing. Jews believe God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses.		
Seder Meal	The special Passover <i>Seder plate</i> (ke'are) is a special plate containing symbolic foods used during the Passover Seder.	Exodus- The story of Moses and Passover		
The sabbath	The holy day for Jews.	Passover is when Jews remember being led out of slavery by Moses. The Seder plate is a special meal celebrated at the start of Passover.
