Sevington Victorian School is a wonderful resource. Set in the heart of the Wiltshire countryside, it is a perfect period piece where history truly comes alive.

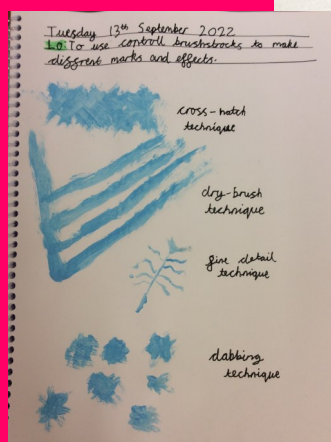
