Strike

As you may be aware, the largest teachers union in the country (NEU) has called their members to strike on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March. Subject leaders and senior leaders joined our support and challenge partner (Felix Rayner) and 2 colleagues from the trust to look closely at our work across the school. I am pleased that the initial reports are extremely positive. There is always something to work on however and we will continue to learn and develop in order to provide your children with the best learning experiences that they deserve.

This week was International's Women's day. For years, women have marked the now-annual event on 8 March in different ways, but mostly to build momentum on issues that matter to them, and to inspire change.

Congratulations to Tyler who was named man of the match for his great defending during this weeks football match




Brielle received her bronze badge for reaching 30 house points.
