

Bumblebees making foxes from The Gingerbread Man story and observing what happens to gingerbread men in different puddles.










# How to make Gingerbread men



Robins made a visit to the Kingfishers this week to read them their persuasive letters that they worked really hard on.






















Kingfishers investigating how to strengthen a bridge during their science lesson.
