Dear parents and carers,

As we near the end of our first term, now is a good time to talk about the curriculum we teach in school. One of my main responsibilities in school is ensuring that what we teach the children is challenging enough and gives the children the knowledge they need in all subjects. I'm sure you will have asked your children what they have learnt in school today and are likely to have had the response I get from my son of nothing! So one way to get a real answer to that question is to ask them about specifics, something Mr Booth mentioned in last week's newsletter. For example in Robins, Sparrows and Wrens they have been looking at how times have changed since the 1980s. They have learnt about fashion, technology and toys. In Puffins and Kingfishers they have been learning about what life was like for children during the reign of Queen Victoria. Hummingbirds, Falcons, Eagles and Kestrels have learnt about the Anglo-Saxon period of English history and how England became one united kingdom.
