Dear Parent/Carer

Another (rather damp) week seems to have flown by and despite the appalling weather children have been working hard to ensure that they maintain their levels of resilience when it comes down to meeting the expected standards set by our teachers.

In assembly this week we have been talking about anti-bullying week and completing activities that highlight how we can tackle bullying. This year's theme has been called 'reach out' highlighting the importance of making sure that bullying is not ignored. To this end, as a school we have been re-educating the children on what constitutes bullying. Physical and verbal bullying are more obvious behaviours that we can tackle at school. Our success rate in tackling these areas is high. However, the emergence of indirect bullying has particularly been highlighted this week. Social media companies have a really important role to play in tackling bullying but they are often too slow to react as the damage can be done. As adults we have a role to play in protecting children from being open to the possibility of on-line bullying so if you have allowed your child to have a social media account such as Tik-Tok, Instagram, Snapchat, then you are putting them at risk. All of these require users to be 13+yrs old. The vast majority of alleged bullying issues that we deal with tend to come from this source. It is in those non-directed times when pupils have their own space and time and may well be outside that dysregulated behaviours emerge as children can often feel protected behind an electronic veil. They don't often see the damage done. We will continue, with your support, to educate the children in this area and we ask that you can do your part. I look forward to working alongside our newly appointed anti-bullying ambassadors this academic year.

Today is Children in Need day. Whilst I know that normally we would be asking you for contributions to this fantastic charity, we are acutely aware of the rise in inflation and cost of living crisis that we all face. You have already been extremely supportive of our PTA and we want that to continue. To this end we have been selective about the charities we support this year. This is also Christmas jumper day when we hope to support the charity [Save the Children](#).

- Excuse me


Finally, in all lessons you should try and say positive things to boost peoples mood!

Children from puffin class gave a very important presentation on how to stay safe on the internet during today's assembly


