Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly thank you for all of your kind wishes following my absence last week. I am recovered now and back to normal. It is really satisfying to know that the community cares about the staff and the school so much.

Changes to how pupils enter the school in the mornings.

In assembly this week, I spoke to the children and staff about a change that I want to trial from next week. As the children have been in bubbles for a long time the arrangements for the start of the day have not been easy to negotiate. Pupils currently enter via their external classroom door and walk through the classroom to get to the cloak area then walk back into the classroom to start work. This causes pupils to waste time and not settle to learn quickly enough. I want the start of day to be a little bit smoother so, from Monday, children will either enter through the terrace doors if they are in Falcons, Eagles or Kestrels or through the doors outside of the hall if they are in Puffins, Kingfishers, Hummingbirds, Robins, Sparrows and Wrens. Staff will be on hand to direct pupils to where they need to go. This change only affects pupils in Y1-6. The arrangements for children in the EYFS (Pre-school, Nursery and Reception) will stay the same. Children will be greeted by their teacher at their classroom door in the cloakroom area. If you would like to speak to a teacher, you will need to do so in advance. We will see how the trial goes next week and if it is successful, we will continue the system next term. Snacks for KS1 and LKS2 will be available outside the hall first thing in the morning and we encourage children to buy snacks before going to the cloak area. Next week we would like to check how many children need a school jumper/cardigan. Please can you send your child to school in their full school uniform next week.
