Dear Parents and Carers

What a cold and frosty week it has been. I feel like the novelty of the fresh mornings wears off when we have to defrost the cars each morning but being able to be outdoors in the winter sunshine is often uplifting.

This week we have been hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic with a number of pupils and staff affected by the virus and/or positive lateral flow tests. I hope you agree that we have done extremely well to keep all year groups and classes running and that has been down to the determination of our staff team. Very few activities have been affected. Teachers have been working from home where they can and feel well enough and the children have responded positively to this hybrid approach, which is set to continue for the rest of this term. I am so grateful to the staff who have stepped up and taught the children in the absence of a teacher and enabled the transitions from one lesson to another.

COVID-19 transmission rates are high locally but there is light at the end of the tunnel. On Wednesday the Government changed the rules again mid-week with the children in secondary schools no longer requiring masks. Staff in our school will continue to wear masks in communal areas for the time being. Thank you for continuing to inform us if your child is ill either with or without COVID. Please be patient with staff if we constantly chase you for an attendance update. We have an obligation to share our data with Public Health Swindon and the Trust. Should the rates in your child's class be deemed higher than normal, we will issue a 'warn and inform' letter but we only do this in agreement with Public Health. In the meantime we will try to support you if you yourselves contract COVID-19 for as long as we possibly can. (I am getting used to driving our minibus around our local community to pick up and drop off children.)

This week's assembly was a reminder about the importance of remaining resilient and determined. It was the story of a penguin who wanted to fly. Of course we all know that penguins are better at swimming and can't fly but, in the story we see how with determination, the penguin fulfils his dream. We want to encourage all of our children to have the same level of determination towards their work and we want to encourage them to 'fly'. As their guides we will do this but it is important that children receive the same guidance from home. The next time your child gives up, please remind them of the Magnificent 7 value of 'Never says I can't' and remind them of the story of the penguin who wanted to fly.

Finally I want to welcome to our school 3 pupils who have joined us from overseas Daniel in Kestrels, Sonia in Kingfishers and Sophia in Puffins. We are happy that you have chosen the Seven Fields family. We have a lot of visitors coming to see the school at the moment and it appears that Seven Fields is becoming the school of choice within the local community. Thank you then if you have spoken positively about the work we are doing here.
