It was great that so many of our Year 5 and 6 parents went to Kingsdown's parents evening last night. They are the only partner secondary in the River Learning Trust and they have so much to offer our pupils. If you missed the opportunity to see the school in action and your child is coming up to secondary school age either Y5 or Y6 then do get in touch and they will be happy to take you on a visit and I will allow time off in the day.

Following on from the work that our parents have completed last year, the school was able to lobby the local councillors to be put forward for the School safe environment Zones programme this year. SSEZ puts in place a package of measures that aim to encourage change and improve safety outside and in the vicinity of schools. FAQ's available from this <u>link</u>. For Seven Fields this means the possible introduction of School Street which will prevent obstructions on Leigh Road during drop off and pick up times. Bumblebees met our class pets Jasmine ad Daisy the guinea pigs. They enjoyed feeding them dandelions.
























Kingfishers became super scientists during their science lesson this week and built electrical circuits with the end results lighting up small lightbulbs.
























The children in Puffins class got stuck in during their Science lesson this week and used materials to recreate sedimentary rock.




