

This week Kestrels have been mixing colours, shades and tones in Art lessons.








Bumblebee class have been painting self portraits this week.














They have also been reading their story of the week The Colour Monster together. Also this week they have been practicing their art skills by painting self portraits.



















Falcons Maths lesson - adding using column addition with Harvey taking the role of class teacher
