Welcome back to the new term and new year. I hope everyone had a fantastic Christmas break and we are all raring to go for the new year.

COVID-19 precautions

Following on from Government announcements regarding the transmission of the Omicron variant, little has changed for us from the precautions we were taking prior to the end of last term. There is still social distancing within classrooms and groups are being kept as separately as possible in the hall and the play areas. The biggest change you and your child will notice is that whilst staff are not wearing face coverings in the areas where they work e.g. office or classrooms, when they move around school we have been advised that we should wear them. This means that we also have an expectation that should you wish to come to school, please make a prior appointment and wear a face covering on arrival. These precautions will be reviewed weekly. Please be assured that staff continue to test themselves using lateral flow devices twice weekly and if they need to isolate they will try to continue to provide face to face teaching remotely if possible.

This week in assembly we looked at New Year's resolutions. I'm not sure if you have made any this year or if you have even given them a thought? I think it might be a dying tradition. However throughout most of the media we are inundated with different opportunities to try new things such as 'Veganuary' or 'dry' January or even 'red' January. I shared with the children that this time of year is an opportunity to look at ourselves with renewed energy, enthusiasm and vigour. January as I'm sure many of you know was named after the Roman God Janus who is often depicted with two faces. The faces look in opposite directions, one to the past and the other the future. 


