# Seven Fields Primary School-Newsletter

#### Dear Parent/Carer

I have just come back from a cluster meeting at Kingsdown Secondary School where I met with a number of old faces and some current school pupil siblings. It was brilliant to see how much more mature the children had grown, how responsible and articulate they were and how the school is working hard to support all those who have come from Seven Fields and the surrounding primaries. I certainly got the impression that it was a school that is really going places. I look forward to working closely with our Kingsdown colleagues in the Spring.

This week we marked the start of Advent in preparation for Christmas and the children all made their Christingles which we have taken photos of and displayed later in this newsletter.

In assembly I spoke to the children about the value of the week which is forgiveness. I showed them the picture of a paper chain (topical for the time of year) but I also spoke to the children about how if one person is holding either side of the chain and pulls it in opposite directions it is likely to break. This of course means and symbolizes the tension in our relationships during the festive period. The tension between us is often drawn more during the festive period as worries around finances, getting the right presents, having enough food and receiving visitors we have not seen for a long time. These emotional concerns as well as those exacerbated by Covid all add up to us feeling uncertain and often disagreements can lead to feelings of anger and hurt. It is at those times that we can choose to forgive the person who has hurt us even though we might not really feel like it. As soon as we do though, we are taking control of our feelings and instantly we can feel happy again.

Some of you may be putting up the decorations for Christmas this weekend and some of you may well be making paper chains (I know it's a traditional party game in school). As you do think of the story in the video found <a href="here">here</a>. If the chain breaks we can easily fix it. If someone hurts us we can fix our feelings through forgiveness.

#### COVID-19 info

Some parents have asked if we are going to be making masks mandatory following recent government guidelines and increases in the transmission rates. At the moment we are only restricting masks to any mass gatherings inside with ventilation. As most parents gather outside, the space is well ventilated; however, if parents choose to wear a mask and socially distance themselves, the school would be supportive of their decision.



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
