

Ingredients

- · 8 chicken thighs
- 2 large peppers, 1 yellow, 1 red, cut into long strips
- 500g new potatoes, washed, skins kept on and left whole
- 2 tbsp olive oil

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- 2 tsp Italian mixed herbs
- · A small handful of fresh parsley, roughly chopped

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
Method

- Preheat the oven to 200°C or 180°C if you have a fan oven.
- In a large baking tray, mix all of the chicken, peppers, potatoes, oil and herbs well, ensuring everything is covered well in the oil and herbs.
- Spread all of the ingredients across the tray, and place in the oven for 45 minutes or until the potatoes are soft and tender and the chicken is golden brown. After 20 minutes or so, toss the tray to mix everything up.
- Once cooked, serve evenly onto plates. Serve with salad and/or a fresh baguette.
