Key Vocabulary

Claude Monet - he was a famous painter.

Pencil Grades - The "grade" or "hardness" of the pencil. This means that it's darker, smoother, smudgier and doesn't hold as sharp of a point.

Landscape - A landscape is the visible features of an area of land.

Sketch - a rough drawing representing the of an object or scene.

Evaluating - To assess how something went and say what went well and what could be improved.
